Whether you're replacing a boiler or renovating a multi-unit social housing building, our financial incentives can help make your energy-efficiency improvements happen.

Programs for multi-unit buildings

Program ¹	Rebate	Description
Social housing retrofit support	varies	get funding for an energy study (up to \$5,000), project implementation support (up to \$7,000) and rebates for upgrades to save electricity and natural gas
Commercial new construction	up to \$500,000	get whole-building energy performance incentives for new multi-unit residential, institutional and mixed-use buildings

Rebates for natural gas equipment

Program ¹	Rebate	Description
Boilers	up to \$75,000	for installing eligible high-efficiency boilers for heating an existing or new building
Water heaters	varies	for installing eligible high-efficiency central water heaters for domestic hot water in an existing or new building



Rebates for electrical equipment²

Program ¹	Rebate	Description
Commercial lighting	up to \$220 per unit	for high-efficiency LED lighting, signage and controls for common areas of buildings, parkades and outside
Foodservice and laundry equipment	up to \$6,600 per unit	for ENERGY STAR [®] certified commercial clothes washers, cooking equipment and dishwashers, as well as demand-controlled ventilation for kitchens
Heat pumps and electric water heaters	up to \$600 per ton	for high-efficiency cold climate, variable refrigerant flow and packaged terminal heat pumps, as well as ENERGY STAR certified heat pump water heaters
Refrigeration equipment	up to \$1,450 per unit	for ENERGY STAR certified commercial refrigerators, freezers and ice machines, as well as display cases and controls for coolers and vending machines
Variable speed drives	up to \$140 per motor hp	for retrofitting existing motors and fans to improve their energy efficiency

You can have our programs for income-qualified residents³ delivered to multiple homes in your complex.

Program ¹	Rebate	Description
Energy conservation assistance	free	residents can get a free home energy evaluation, installation of energy-saving products ⁴ and advice on saving energy
Furnaces and boilers ⁵	\$3,000 to \$3,400 per unit ⁶	for replacing natural gas furnaces or boilers that are at least 10 years old with eligible ENERGY STAR [®] certified models
Water heaters ⁵	\$500 to \$2,500 per water heater	for replacing existing individual residential natural gas water heaters with eligible ENERGY STAR certified models
